

CREATED TO PRAISE—Course description for 2010

NEW!! Archery (Dwight Rohrer): Bows 'N Arrows with targets. Learn and practice the safe aspects of this outdoor sport (two sessions).

Audition Prep (Karla Santiago): Some singing, some dancing, some reading from the script – put it all together and you'll be ready to audition for a show!

NEW!! Baking Delicious Cookies (Marcy High): We will bake cookies together and enjoy eating! Students will take cookies home for their family.

NEW!! Basic Needlework (Carol Blevins): You will get to play with a little sewing, a little quilting, a little appliqué, a little punch, and whatever else you might want to add! You will be making a banner that you can hang in your room (two sessions, sec).

Basic Cake Decorating (Michelle Aviles): Students will learn some basic techniques for decorating cakes that can be used to make beautiful cakes for any occasion. These techniques can also be applied to cupcakes and other desserts (two double period classes offered, any age).

Bible Discovery (Linda Helmus): We will experience Bible study as a treasure hunt, learning how to unpack familiar stories and discovering hidden ones. You will be invited to find your story in God's story, write your own faith story, and begin a prayer journal. Bring your own Bible and notebook if you have one (ele)!

Bible Study (TBA): We will be learning about the love of God throughout the Bible (sec). Bring your own Bible if you have one

Calligraphy (Joanne Young Stephan): An old, stylistic way of writing written language(s), students will practice using a writing pen that provides the fanciful style associated with calligraphy. The **secondary** class will learn blackletter (old English) lower case/capitals/decorating letters. The **elementary** class will learn writing with italic letters.

NEW!! Chinese (Joyce Zimmerman): Each day we will learn something new! We will look at Chinese phonics on the first day. On the following days we will learn numbers, shapes, colors, animals and learn a Chinese rhyme and song!

NEW!! Chinese Cooking (Joyce Zimmerman): Each day we will make a new Chinese food. These foods will be Cantonese style fried rice, wonton soup, pan fried wonton, gourmet pan fried tofu with turkey, and Chinese dessert.

Basic Chalk Art (James Snyder): Learn to illustrate Biblical messages through drawing and/or singing using special chalk, elaborate lighting, and Christian music to share the Gospel truth in a unique way.

Chess (Sam Smith): This class offers a time to learn, hone your chess skills, or just play with other students.

Clay (Vaughn Stauffer): Students will create unique clay pieces by hand using simple techniques including slab, pinching and coiling. Students will also get to observe how the pottery wheel is used to create forms. (three sessions, age based)

Community Service (Galen Sauder): This is a double session class. Students will be the hands and feet of Christ with local agencies (double period).

NEW!! Delicious Gourmet Desserts (Gail Wireman): Try your hand at making a variety of mouth watering desserts for all occasions (three sessions, age based).

Drama – (Harry Jarrett): Actors will learn 5 techniques to improve their acting skills and be more believable and comfortable on stage. Taught by a professionally trained actor (Two sessions, by age).

Drumming (TBA): a modern yet simplistic approach to the art of world hand drumming.

German- Dash of Deutsch! (Elizabeth Dete): Learn German vocabulary such as colors, numbers, articles of clothing, body parts, food and animals through songs and games!

Guitar (Wayne Thompson): Students need to provide their own guitar for this class. Students will work on chording and plucking a variety of songs.

Hand bells (John Miller): No experience needed to explore the joys of hand bell ringing! Students will learn basic hand bell techniques as they prepare several songs.

Hiking (Melissa Armer): We will spend our week hiking trails and exploring the wonders of God's creations in nature! We will use journals to record any experiences and/or sketch a particular spot where God's presence captured you. All will be encouraged to share at least one sketch or entry from their journal at the weeks end. (Double period)

If I had Wings (Take Flight!) (Wayne Lehman): After a brief history of how we humans discovered our "wings," we will design and build simple airplanes and do some flight experiments of our own. We will also try some RC flying and perhaps visit Lancaster airport. (double period)

Instrumental Ensemble (TBA): Students with at least one year of playing experience on a band or orchestra instrument are invited to join us as we pool our abilities and praise God through an instrumental offering! Please bring your own instrument.

Jewelry Making (Kerry Rohrbach): Beginner Jewelry making- explore basic techniques of jewelry making, including stringing and finishing various beads on different types of cords. Projects include making a bracelet and necklace.

Advanced Jewelry Making (Kerry Rohrbach): You will learn a new project idea on how to make a statement necklace with crystals and ribbon. Also, learn found object art to make a bracelet or necklace. (two sessions)

Keyboard to Organ (Glenn Lehman): This class is for students with piano experience who would like to explore the "King of Instruments" - the pipe organ. In class we take whatever level piano/keyboard skills the student already has mastered and apply those skills to organ playing, so that at the end every student will play something on the organ that sounds like the pipe organ. Some practice required at home. Emphasis will be on giving everyone a positive introduction to the unique sounds of the organ.

Knitting (Beginning to Knit) -(Kay Straley): This class will prepare the student to know how to knit. They will learn to cast on, knit, purl and to bind off. It helps if you are familiar with slip knots.

Knitting II – (Beyond the basics) (Kay Straley): This class is for students who know how to cast on, knit and purl. They will learn how to increase, decrease, yarn overs and do a simple pattern stitch. They will also learn how to read a pattern. They may select their own project to work on or I will bring one along. However, please supply your own needles and yarn for any project you choose.

Mime (Donya Leugers): This technique involves no speaking; only acting out a story with body motions.

Newsletter (Marlene Weaver): We will be writing stories and sharing unique events in a daily newsletter at Created 2 Praise!

Orff (Pat Martin): Students will use a variety of Orff instruments to play and improvise.

Orienteering (*Lancaster County Environmental Center*): We will be learning how to use a compass and read a topographic map as well as the use of handheld GPS units. (two sessions)

Photo Editing/Photography combined: (Galen Sauder): Students will learn photography and take time to do photo editing. Topics to be covered include: retouching photos, weird effects, color balancing your monitor, putting several photographs together. Students are strongly suggested to bring a digital camera of their own.

Photography (Galen Sauder): Students will be taught about the basics of photography, as well as many of the technical considerations around today's digital cameras. The course will focus on taking photos, but some of it will go over the computer side of things. Students are strongly suggested to bring a digital camera of their own. (Two sessions, age based)

Projection (Tyler Morton): A great opportunity for those interested in using technology. We will learn how to use equipment to project words and images on screens for use in church or other functions requiring video, words or photos on a screen.

Rush to Learn Russian (Elizabeth Dete): Learn to form the Russian letters and learn colors, numbers, animals, weather expressions, food, clothing and body parts through songs and games.

Scrapbooking (Becky Marshall): Come with pictures and a scrapbook (if you have one) and by the end of the week you will have created one or two lovely scrapbook pages. (two sessions, age based)

Song writing (Beth Jarrett): Learn techniques to write songs. Students will have an opportunity to practice writing their own song.

Survival Skills (Lancaster County Environmental Center): Learn basic survival skills including how to avoid getting lost and how to build a fire!

Team Building Games (Karla Santiago and Addy Rymar): Together we are strong. How do individuals achieve success when the outcome depends on everyone participating toward a single goal? Build communication skills and discover what can be accomplished when everyone works together.

NEW!! Using God's Money (Discovering God's way of Handling Money) (Mike Schwartz): Through fun activities and group discussions, we will explore the role money plays in our lives - emphasizing the importance of being good stewards of the resources God has given us. Our goals will be to gain a better understanding of the joys of giving, the discipline of saving, and the wisdom of spending. (secondary)

Voice (John Miller): A local school music and choir director for many years; come, sing, and join your voice with many voices in praise.

Watercolor (Crystal Dull): We will follow step by step in how to create a detailed watercolor. Come learn various watercolor techniques! If you have watercolor paint tubes, white tip or real watercolor brushes bring those. (Two sessions)

Worship Dance (Melissa Armer): We will worship using creative movement to interpret the lyrics of a contemporary praise song. We will minister to others by using our GIFT of dance to perform a short dance routine at weeks end.

Worship Team (Darlene Hein): All singers, drummers, keyboard and guitar players are welcome to join us prepare music to praise God. This group will lead in closing worship each day.
